- Dalmat starts the discussion on SCCUDD's need to consider its ability to continue its efforts going forward, even after the Drug Free Communities Support Grant ends in September 2019. The question is how can SCCUDD keep key activities and programs going after the grant expires.

The group identifies key items that it wants to continue: Lead and Seed, community forums, educational materials, school partnerships (attendees wonder why no school representatives are at this meeting), public service announcements, law enforcement

	<p>support, youth survey.</p> <p>Resources identified: \$125,000 per year for the next 3.5 years, in-kind services, office space at county Public Health Department, volunteers, community support and fund-raising. Future resources could include other grants, including a mentoring grant. The group agrees it needs more information about grants and grant-writing. Fund-raising should be on-going, as well as efforts to find business sponsors for items such as educational materials and community forums. Two ways to seek/save money: create a database of potential donors; write the youth survey ourselves.</p>
