	Discussion ensued regarding appropriate times to conduct committee meetings. Coalition members agreed that separate meetings should be held even if the committee meetings are held before or after the coalition meetings. Sustainability	Discussion Deborah explained that the coalition must have representatives from all 12 sectors of the community. Without this, the DFC grant will not be renewed.
