Welcome and Introductions <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Additions to the Agenda</li> </ul>	<b>Discussion</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mike reported on the most recent results of Schuyler County compliance checks. He explained the two different kinds of checks and how they are conducted. The results are as follows: Off Premise Businesses- 9 out of 10 passed (90% passing rate) Wineries- 9 out of 10 failed (10% passing rate) The businesses that failed their compliance check were sent a failure notification letter that included an offer for tips and training. The results were discussed with much concern. How do we change this? Suggestions included approaching the winery association with results.</li> </ul>
Committee Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ellie reported on behalf of the Implementation Committee and included the following updates: -Committee will meet on Thursday with the Village of Montour Falls to follow up on the Tobacco Free Outdoors policy presented in September. -A recent presentation was held at WGCS for 35-40 faculty and staff members regarding juuling that included information for parents and Catch My Breath curriculum for high school classrooms.</li> </ul>

	<p>-The committee has discussed the governor’s proposal for NYS Tobacco 21 laws, ending tobacco sales in pharmacies, and actions against tobacco companies targeting teens.</p> <p>-Ellie recently presented Tobacco 21 policies to Schuyler County Board of Health and shared results from the 2018 Schuyler County Community Health Assessment showing that 67.5% of residents would support the county passing a law to raise the legal age to purchase tobacco to 21.</p> <p>-Amber has given several presentations on the RX deactivation packets. 85 packets have handed out to OFA meal sites. 75 went to home meal delivery. Packets were also handed out to Quinlan’s, Probation and Selah Wellness Yoga &amp; Healing Ministry.</p> <p>-The Beer Garden presentation is waiting for a date to meet with WG Promotions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Prevention Committee reports that Gretchen is teaching Too Good for Drugs and Mel is teaching Catch My Breath at the OMCS after-school program. WGCS is interested in adding these classes to their after-school program.</li> <li>• Assessment Committee has been working to finalize questions for the student survey. They have also been working on the logic model and checking data.</li> <li>• STAND – Ward has been busy recruiting new youth members and businesses interested in working with the youth. Aidan reported that the group is looking to host a Nerf War as a drug free event that would be include teens from all three high schools and be held at WGCS Field House. STAND is also preparing to attend the CADCA National Leadership Forum in Washington D.C. February 3<sup>rd</sup> -7<sup>th</sup>. Wyatt &amp; Wrett will be filming much of the Forum events to post on social media.</li> </ul> <p><b>Action Items</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ask Mel about Pre- &amp; Post-program surveys for Catch My Breath.</li> </ul>
DFC Grant Updates and Questions	<p><b>Discussion</b></p> <p>Deborah informed Coalition of weekly phone conferences with the grant writer every Monday at 9:00 AM. Discussion ensued regarding the grant writing process. The number of pages submitted for the grant last year was cut from 25 to 15, expect that trend to continue.
