RE: AUTHORIZE AMENDING THE CONTRACT LANGUAGE WITH TREAHY CONSULTATION SERVICES LLC FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF “RAISE THE AGE” REQUIREMENTS – SOCIAL SERVICES

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 128-18 authorized a contract effective May 1, 2018 with Treahy Consultation Services LLC (“contractor”) for professional services related to implementation of the state-manded “Raise the Age” legislation, and

WHEREAS, said contract provided a schedule of payments to the contractor for fees, costs and expenses under said agreement, and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the description of expenses covered in order to ensure compliance with New York State Office of Children and Family Services regulations, revisions and recommendations, necessary for state-reimbursement, and

WHEREAS, the total contact amount has not changed and shall remain capped at the lesser of \$15,000.00 or the county’s “pro rata share,” as defined in the original contact.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Legislature be hereby authorized to execute a contract amendment with Treahy Consultation Services LLC, in accordance with the above, contract approved by the Schuyler County Attorney.

RE: AUTHORIZE GRANT APPLICATION AND FUNDING FROM THE NEW YORK STATE OFFICE FOR THE AGING FOR THE UNMET NEED INITIATIVE – OFFICE FOR THE AGING

WHEREAS, effective April 1, 2019, the enacted SFY 2019-2020 budget contained an additional appropriation of \$15 million to specifically fund eligible services for individuals with an unmet need as reported by individual Area Agencies on Aging, and

WHEREAS, during the 2017 annual evaluation of the Schuyler County Office for the Aging by the NYS Office for the Aging, it was reported that there were several individuals on a wait list for specific services, and

WHEREAS, from the \$15 million appropriated for unmet need, the Schuyler County Office for the Aging was tentatively allocated an amount determined by formula to significantly reduce or eliminate any reported unmet need, and

WHEREAS, as directed under the funding guidelines, the Area Agency on Aging has the ability and flexibility to be creative in their approach to serve as many clients as possible who have an unmet need, and

WHEREAS, the appropriation language waives the local match requirements for this specific funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Legislature be hereby authorized to sign a grant application for funding from the New York State Office for the Aging for the Unmet Need initiative, for the term April 1, 2019 through March 31, 2020, in the amount of \$41,467, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Schuyler County Treasurer is hereby directed to establish the Unmet Need grant accordingly in cooperation with the Office for the Aging Department.

RE: AUTHORIZE CONTRACT WITH MVP HEALTH CARE FOR REIMBURSEMENT AS
